#### 2. REPORTS AND COMMUNICATION

- 2.1 Superintendent's Update Craig Guensler
- Superintendent Guensler wanted to clarify a few things for the board. There's been a lot of questions about the definition of in-person instruction. He explained that in-person instruction is under the immediate physical supervision of the certificated teacher within the classroom. It is not distance learning.
- ➤ He talked about SB/AB 86 and what is required of the board. The only plan the board will have to approve is the expenditure plan. All the other plans and MOU's have been approved. Negotiations are not required for us because we are already open. However, if we decide at some point, we want to add days or hours that would be negotiable.
- ➤ There are two different pots of money coming from the State. The reopening plan money and Prop 98. There are two sources of money coming from the Federal Government as well. The 1<sup>st</sup> stimulus ESSER #1 is based on Title I counts and the stimulus package signed today ESSER #2. All of the pots of money are One Time only funding with a lot of strings and parameters. All of the money is supposed to be spent in a year.
- ➤ Superintendent Guensler gave an update on the vaccination counts for our employees. Currently 10 employees have received both doses. 96 have received the 1<sup>st</sup> dose. A large portion of this group will get the second dose next Wednesday and the following Wednesday. 4 employees have appointments soon. 24 have not scheduled an appointment yet and 72 are opting out.
